Printing, Assembling, and Using Your Minibook

To Print and Assemble

- 1) Print PDF file of minibook
- 2) At copier, print double sided copies of book. You may need to invert the second side of each page as many copiers will print the backside upside down if you do not. See next page for numeration when copying.
- 3) Fold book in half and staple together.

Using Minibooks

Minibooks are a ocabular and sroom. They 2M¢ n t Foreigr rei rce angi ear ay also provide a h len what they ne-s bo onn rion icou ge s to s ith eir iren are learning.

Follow these four steps when introducing and utilizing minibooks:

- 1) Take a picture walk- before you begin to read, "walk" through the book, showing the pictures and identifying known vocabulary.
- 2) Read the text out loud to the class. This gives them a chance to associate the text with the pictures.
- 3) Hand out the copied books, one to each student, and have the class read along with you. (Wow, you can read Spanish!)
- 4) Allow time for students to color the illustrations. This is the perfect time for the teacher to go to each student and ask he/she to read to /with you individually.

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*If you will be spending more than one class time on the minibook, be sure to go through steps 2, 3, & 4 each time you work with the minibook.

When copying minibooks, the numeration is as follows for double sided copying (you will need to set your copier to '1 to double sided' or 'single sheet to double sided'):

For a four sheet pdf minibook:


Cover page on one side; pages 1, 6 on the backside Pages 5, 2 on or page 2, on the backside

Cover page on one side; un-numbered page, page 9 on the backside Pages 2, 7 on one side; pages 8, 1 on the backside Pages 4, 5 on one side; pages 6, 3 on the backside




